Unbridled Enthusiasm

July 10, 2016 ~ 2 Samuel 6.1-15 (*Read only thru v11*)

Part 1 ~ David's 1st Attempt to Transport Ark to Jerusalem

(Uzzah's Death Spoiled a National Celebration)

- ❖ v1 ~ ".. David gathered all the choice men of Israel, thirty thousand."
 - ♦ Kiriath-jearim is a mere 6 miles W/NW from Jerusalem
 - ♦ If <u>Legacy</u> represents Jerusalem, the ark would be in <u>Bennington</u>
 - ♦ Labor Day parade in downtown Omaha (thousand people?)
- ❖ v6 ~ ".. Uzzah put out his hand to the ark of God and took hold of it .."
- ❖ v7 ~ ".. Then the anger of the Lord was aroused .. God struck him there .. he died."
 - ♦ Uzzah was one of Abinadab's sons / Ark was in his home 20 years
 - ♦ What Uzzah did was meant to be helpful, so common, so understandable
 - ♦ What God did, by comparison, seems so hurtful, so shocking, so inexplicable

Dark Times ~ Corruption of Priesthood (~80 yrs earlier)

- ❖ <u>Tabernacle</u> worship corrupted by Eli's family
 - → Eli's sons were wicked priests / "they did not know the Lord" (1 Sam 2.12)
 - 1. They took the meat while fat was on it (1 Sam 2.15-16)
 - 2. They <u>slept</u> with women who gathered at door of tabernacle (1 Sam 2.22)
 - The women wanted food / Hophni & Phineas provided it
 - ♦ A prophet <u>foretold</u> their <u>deaths</u> and the collapse of Eli's house (1 Sam 2.34)
- ❖ Just afterwards Philistines defeated them and carried off ark
 - ♦ They attempted to use the ark in battle as had been done in wilderness
 - ♦ Israelites learned that disregarding God's commands has consequences

Dark Times ~ Tyrannical King & Civil War(~50 yrs earlier)

- ❖ Samuel arose and judged them but his sons were evil too, like Eli's
 - ♦ The people wanted a king and God gave them one / just like their neighbors
- ❖ Saul was initially humble but quickly became proud and selfish
 - ♦ Saul abused power worse than priests / tyranny reigned for 30+ years
 - → <u>David</u> arose (*anointed king*) but Saul <u>persecuted</u> him for decade
- ❖ Saul and Jonathan <u>died</u> in battle / <u>Abner</u> makes <u>Ishbosheth</u> king (**2 Sam 2.8**)
 - ♦ Read 2 Sam 3.1 ~ "Now there was a long war .. weaker and weaker."

Xition: A revival was coming to the land / David was bringing it . . .

David was Living the Dream

- ❖ He'd been anointed king by Samuel as a teenager (~20 yrs earlier)
 - ♦ God blessed him immensely and protected him from Saul
 - ♦ He'd led Judah as their king for over 7 years from Hebron (2 Sam 2.1)
- ❖ Ishbosheth confronts Abner and he betrays his king to David (power politics)
 - ♦ Joab murders Abner to retain his role as commander-in-chief (2 Sam 3.22)
 - ♦ Ishbosheth is murdered by 2 captains of his troops (2 Sam 4)
- ❖ Elders of Israel ask David to become their king too (2 Sam 5)
 - ♦ David takes Jerusalem ("the heights") and establishes his throne there
 - ♦ Philistines immediately attack him twice but they're defeated both times

Meanwhile ~ Ark of the Covenant Languished for Generations

- During time of the Judges ark resided mostly in Bethel & Shiloh
 - ♦ Tabernacle sometimes somewhere else so proper worship not maintained
- ❖ About 80 years earlier the ark had fallen into enemy hands
 - → Hophni & Phineas carried it into battle against Philistines and were killed
- ❖ David knew the importance of the ark (Read 1 Chr 13.1-3)
 - ♦ He took action immediately to co-locate it with his throne

David Erred Critically in Initial Attempt to Move Ark

- Duties of Sons of Kohath (Read Numbers 4.1-15)
 - ♦ Priests broke down tabernacle and covered everything
 - veil / ark / table / lampstand / altar / all utensils
 - ♦ Kohathites were tasked with carrying them
- ❖ <u>Six mistakes</u> David made that day
 - 1. Ark was to be <u>covered</u> (Priests were to do this)
 - 2. Ark was to be <u>carried</u> (He had it on a new cart as had the Philistines)
 - 3. Ark was to be carried by Kohathites (Not Levites, let alone Kohathites)
 - 4. Ark was to be carried by Kohathites using poles (no mention of them)
 - 5. Ark was to be carried by sanctified Kohathites using poles (Num 8.21-22)
 - 6. Ark was <u>not</u> to be <u>touched</u> (even by Kohathites)

Xition: Before we discuss 2nd attempt to move ark let's review Philistine experience

The Ark of the Covenant in Philistia

- ❖ The Philistines feared the God of the Israelites (1 Sam 4.6-7)
- First God humbled then destroyed their god, Dagon (1 Sam 5.1-4)
- ❖ Then His hand was then heavy upon the <u>people</u> of Ashdod (1 Sam 5.6)
 - ♦ He ravaged them and struck them with tumors
- Then He brought great destruction upon Gath (1 Sam 5.9)
 - → He struck the men of the city (small and great) with tumors
- The people of Ekron complained as the ark arrived (Read 1 Sam 5.10)
 - ♦ God brought <u>deadly destruction</u> throughout the city
 - ♦ Men who didn't die were stricken with tumors
- Note the escalation and the narrowing of God's judgment over months
- "Why did God not just strike the Philistines dead from the very first?"

God's Punishments Predicated on Revelation and Expectations

- * "What did the Philistines know of God and His law?" Little or nothing
 - ♦ Would they have been expected to know it? No
- * "What did the Israelites know of God and His law?" Little or nothing
 - ♦ Would they have been expected to know it? Yes
- ❖ God's mercy was more evident at the start w/Philistines / Israel's enemy
 - ♦ His justice in regards to His holiness grew over months
- The <u>Israelites</u> ought to have known better
 - ♦ Their ignorance was inexcusable

Part 2 ~ David's 2nd Attempt to Transport Ark to Jerusalem

David Finally Does His Homework

- * Read 2 Sam 6.12-15 ~ "Now it was told King David .. the sound of the trumpet."
 - → David being jealous of Obed-Edom is not the entire story . . .
- ❖ Read 1 Chr 15.1-2 ~ "No one may carry the ark .. before Him forever."
 - ♦ David acknowledges the critical role of the Kohathites in carrying ark
- ❖ Read 1 Chr 15.4-5 ~ "Then David assembled .. of his brethren."
 - ♦ Compare these invitees to those from our Samuel text ~ "all the choice men"
- ❖ David states why 1st attempt failed **v11-13** ~ "And David called .. proper order."

Xition: David's 1st attempt was "unbridled enthusiasm". The bridle he lacked was ..

Regulative Principle of Worship

- ❖ Phil preached on this text in his "Life of David" series in Dec 2012
 - ♦ The title for the message on this text was "Reforming Worship"
 - → He defined & defended the "Regulative Principle of Worship"
- ❖ <u>III</u>: <u>CA PCA Svc</u>: Young woman gave the congregational prayer opening worship
 - ♦ Here at DCC we would never do this . . .
 - ♦ "Are we merely outdated, old-fashioned, or out of step with our time?"
 - ♦ "Do we regard women as inferior to men, less capable, or less holy?"
 - ♦ No. What we are, and will try to remain, is obedient to Scripture
 - ♦ We're committed to this / Even if we must oppose our culture

Uzzah's Death Speaks to More than Obedience in Worship

- Obedience in worship reflects more on elder's obedience or disobedience
 - ♦ But all of us are called to obedience
 - ♦ All of us must apply God's Word consistently to our lives and culture
- Uzzah's life was lost that day due to widespread ignorance of God's Word
 - ♦ David bears a great responsibility for that ignorance
- Our collective obedience begins with widespread knowledge of God's Word
 - ♦ We all bear responsibility for that in our lives and one another's lives

"To Whom Much is Given Shall Much be Required"

- This is a principle derived from God's Word, from Jesus' parables
 - ♦ God rewards some knowledge with greater knowledge
 - ♦ God rewards some obedience with greater obedience
 - ♦ God rewards some wisdom with greater wisdom
- ❖ God rewards His faithful children with contentment and joy
