# **Oppose the Apostates**

July 29, 2018 ~ Jude

#### Read v1-2 ~ Greeting

- ❖ v1a ~ "Jude, a bondservant of Jesus Christ, and brother of James"
  - ♦ Jude and James were half-brothers of Jesus / James' letter opens similarly
  - ♦ They regarded themselves as <u>slaves</u> of Jesus not younger brothers
- ❖ v1b ~ "To those .. called, sanctified by .. Father, and preserved by Jesus Christ"
  - ♦ Jude begins letter with reference to the Trinity.
    - ♦ "called" by Holy Spirit / "sanctified" by Father / "preserved" by Jesus
    - ♦ Jude likes to think and speak in 3's / Trinity referenced in farewell also
- ❖ v2 ~ "Mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you"
  - ♦ Jude's desire is that these 3 blessings be "lavished" upon his readers.
  - ♦ They are so much more valuable (and tangible) than material wealth

#### Read v3-4 ~ Two Groups

- ❖ Jude refers to 2 groups at start of each verse (v3 "beloved" & v4 "certain men")
  - ♦ 2 groups existed then / 2 groups exist now / 2 groups always exist
    - ♦ These are "tares and wheat", "goats and sheep", "lost and saved",
      - "Cain and Abel", "Jacob and Esau", "Jew and Gentile",
      - "forgiven and forsaken", "elect and non-elect"
- ❖ 3 aspects of each group: 1) identity 2) destiny 3) conduct
  - 1. <u>Identity</u> ~ "Where are they?" (in the church) "crept in unnoticed"
    - ♦ Why "unnoticed?" / Didn't draw attention / Character hidden at first
    - ♦ "Certain men" are in church advocating for sin (homosexuality / disobedient)
  - 2. <u>Destiny</u> ~ Some marked for "salvation" / Others for "condemnation"
  - 3. Conduct
    - Sinful thoughts & actions come naturally to everyone
    - ♦ Believers must "contend earnestly" / significant effort needed

## Reread v3 ~ Message Delivered "Once For All"

- Definitive reference to "inspired revelation"
  - ♦ ".. the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints"
  - ♦ It need not and will not again be delivered / needs no improvement
- ❖ The "beloved" must "contend earnestly" against the wolves among them

Xition: Jude defines the wolves in our midst as well as anyone . . .

#### Read v5-7 ~ The Road to Hell

- Focus is on the **destiny** of apostates
- Jude reminds them of something lest they forget
  - ♦ He again shares <u>3 things</u> / All expand upon a common root element
- ❖ Note underlying <u>pattern</u> | <u>Disobedience</u> followed by <u>discipline</u> from God
  - 1. **v5** ~ Unbelief / despite constant miracles -> God killed them
  - 2. **v6** ~ Rebellion / abandoned assigned duties -> God imprisoned them
  - 3. **v7** Perversion / pursuit of pleasure at any cost -> God punished them
- Each correlates with an escalation of judgment upon God's enemies
  - 1. bodily death Jews died as unbelievers in Wilderness
  - 2. bondage beyond grave rich man and Lazarus in Hades
  - 3. eternal judgment by fire torments of hell for those that reject God
- These are to remind us of the coming judgment
- ❖ All apostates will experience all 3 of these stages of judgment

#### Read v8-11 ~ Words Reveal Our Hearts

- Focus is on the words of apostates
- ❖ Jude shares 3 things ~ 1) defile flesh, 2) reject authority, 3) speak evil
  ❖ This section emphasizes the importance of words
- ❖ Read Mt 12.33-37 ~ "Either make the tree .. you will be condemned"
  - ♦ v34 ~ "out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks"
  - ♦ v37 ~ "by your words you will be justified .. or condemned"
- ❖ v10a ~ "speak evil of whatever they do not know"
  - ♦ Wisdom is reserving judgment until we know all of the facts
- ❖ v10b ~ "and whatever they know .. they corrupt themselves"
  - → Later (v19) Jude will use the term "sensual" / This phrase defines it
- ❖ Jude cites 3 examples of such conduct from Old Testament
  - 1. Cain ~ "gone in the way of Cain"
    - ♦ Walked with God / Killed Abel / Lies to God / Whines (selfish)
  - 2. <u>Balaam</u> ~ "<u>run</u> greedily in the <u>error</u> of Balaam"
    - ♦ Resented God's restraint / Sought earthly gain only (materialistic)
  - 3. Korah ~ "perished in the rebellion of Korah"
    - Spoke evil against Moses most humble man on earth (proud/arrogant)

#### Read v12-15 ~ Apostates Are Worthless and Possible Misleading

- Focus is on the *uselessness* of apostates
- ❖ Jude again presents pictures of this 4 this time
- 1. Clouds (without water)
  - ♦ Pretty decorations for the sky / Tools to bring water poor farmers looking up
- 2. Fruit trees (without fruit)
  - ♦ It's past time for the fruit to have come in yet nothing came
  - ♦ Such trees are consuming valuable space good for nothing
- 3. Raging waves of the sea (produces garbage)
  - ♦ Crashing, boisterous, noisy
    - III: Poem ~ "throughout the night they pierce the dark cheered on triumphantly
      - just to be frustrated by the morning light without a mark on their adversary"
- 4. Wandering stars (cannot guide us)
  - ♦ Stars relied upon for navigation / But some were unreliable or inconsistent
- Note Jude covered 1) sky, 2) land, 3) water, and 4) space (everything)
  - ♦ v14-15 ~ Jude quotes Enoch with 4 ungodly's / one for each of these
    - ♦ Ungodly 1) people, 2) deeds, 3) way, and 4) words

#### Read v16-19 ~ Apostates Can Cause Divisions

- Focus is on the <u>divisiveness</u> of apostates
  - ♦ Apostates can do harm to us, to our church, to "the" Church
- We again have Jude present a <u>trio</u> of words
  - ♦ v16 ~ "grumblers, complainers, [sensual mockers]"
- ❖ They <u>use words as tools</u> to get their way <u>complaining</u> or <u>flattering</u>
  - ♦ They appeal is to the "darker" aspects of our natures
  - ♦ Examine the <u>influence</u> a person has on you / Consider their <u>character</u>
  - ♦ Do you influence them or do they influence you? / It may be subtle but real
- People w/evil influence are "sensual" driven by their senses
  - ♦ 1 Cor 6.13 ~ "Food for the stomach and the stomach for food"
  - ♦ Apostates want to be seen as believers yet indulge in sin
    - ♦ Not only do they have <u>no desire for holiness</u>
      - **NOYB** ~ They reject and even mock your concerns
    - ♦ Instead, they <u>want you to join them</u> in their sins

#### Xition: Jude turns his attention back to his beloved

#### Read v20-23 ~ Be Strong in Faith to Help Others

- Jude gives us advice to fight against the erosive effect of apostates
  - ♦ We again see Jude reference all members of the Trinity
  - ♦ The goal or end is the "building up of our faith" / But done via . . .
  - 1. v20 ~ "praying in the Holy Spirit"
  - 2. **v21** ~ "keeping yourselves in the love of God"
  - 3. **v21** ~ "looking for the mercy of .. Jesus Christ"
- Then, with a strong faith, we can assist others
  - ♦ v22 ~ "on some have compassion, making a distinction"
    - ♦ Some are victims or are unaware of the danger / help them to see
  - ♦ v22 ~ "but others save with fear, pulling them out of the fire, hating garment"
    - Others are caught up in sin to a much greater degree
      - You have to be careful to not endanger yourself
      - You push or pull people from fire / You don't embrace someone yucky
  - ♦ III: Swimming Some personally swim to / To other toss a life preserver

#### Read v24-25 ~ Blessing God

- Jude pronounces this benediction at the end of his letter
- ❖ Number 6.24-26 ~ "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you, And give you peace."
- These two blessings or benedictions are very different

Christians have a responsibility to serve and above God

- ♦ In Numbers the speaker requests that God bless the listeners
- ♦ In Jude the speaker blesses God and requests that God bless the listeners
- ❖ Both are valid benedictions from God's Word
