 - Be reasonably certain of a goal or direction
 - Asked 8 questions to test whether a decision was wise / right
 - 2. "Wanting What To Do"
 - Align our hearts with chosen goal or direction
 - Examined difficulty of aligning heart with decision
 - 3. "Planning What To Do"
 - Coordinate our thoughts & actions towards goal
 - 7 aspects good plan 7 elements good planning
 - 4. "<u>Choosing</u> What To Do"
 - Avoid distractions ~ Stay focused
 - Testing & strengthening resolve & fighting laziness
 - 5. "What To <u>Do</u> or <u>Delegate</u>" / Ensure progress ~ No excuses ~ Delegate
- Head / Heart / Head / Heart / Hands & Head

Today's Message – Ensuring Progress is Made by Us or Others

- Today's 5th "What To Do or Delegate" (holding ourselves & others accountable)
- You have to "own" the responsibility as you made the decision
- You may delegate aspects of the work / But you still own it
- 6 things to focus on during this phase

1. Monitor Progress

- III: "What gets measured gets managed"
 - o "What doesn't get measured gets ignored or overlooked"
- Put reliable measures in place without them you're blind
 - Measures needn't be perfect / They can be improved as needed

2. Stay Focused / Don't Get Distracted

- <u>III</u>: <u>Letters c/blame</u> ~ Jefferson Davis to Joseph Johnston (July 1864)
 - Davis concerned about losing Atlanta
 - Replacing Joe Johnston with John Bell Hood was likely a mistake
 - He lost Atlanta "and" the Army of Tennessee (Sherman unopposed)
- Seek solutions / not someone to blame for failure
 - Don't make a bad decision just to "punish" someone / improve situation

Xition: Third thing to do well during execution phase . . .

3. Don't <u>Make</u> Excuses / Don't <u>Accept</u> Excuses

- <u>III</u>: <u>Douglas MacArthur</u> ~ "There is no substitute for victory"
 - Excuses (*however justified*) don't equal accomplishment (*still failure*)
 - But it's part of <u>fallen human nature</u> to make them
- <u>III</u>: <u>Garden of Eden</u> ~ <u>Adam</u> and <u>Eve</u> gave excuses
 - o "The woman you gave me ..." & "The serpent deceived me..."
- Excuses have us looking backward / "Look forward Not backward"
- Seek <u>solutions</u> for success / not <u>excuses</u> for failure

4. Deal With Problems

- Problems surface when things <u>fall behind</u>, when <u>commitments</u> aren't met
 - $\circ~$ Problems may have been present a long time but went $\underline{undetected}$
 - $\circ~$ Develop a culture in which people want to make problems visible
 - i.e., "Don't shoot the messenger"
- Problems must be <u>analyzed</u> for <u>severity</u> and cause / "Are they important?"
 III: KEE error ~ Restarting computer resulted in loss of an hour or more
- Assessment may reveal problem is more / less serious than thought

5. Seek Opportunities

- We ought not conflate the terms "problem" and "opportunity"
- Opportunities ~ things are working but not as well as possible
- If we can do the same job with same resources in ½ time then do it
- <u>III</u>: "Adventures of Jonathan Gullible" taking down trees
- Opportunities are economic disrupters xform a market
 - <u>III</u>: "PSR" eliminate complexity reduce staff by 30%
 - <u>III</u>: "creative destruction" Joseph Schumpeter

6. Delegate As Necessary – "The Jethro Principle"

- Delegation doesn't xfer responsibility / It shares it
- **Exodus 18** ~ Classic example of delegating authority / responsibility
 - Jethro visited Moses and saw him judging people throughout a long day
 - Read vss 13-23 ~ "And so it was .. pace in peace"
 - v17 ~ "The thing that you do is not good"
 - o v18a ~ ".. you and these people .. will surely wear yourselves out"
 - v18b ~ "this is too much for you; you are not able to perform it by yourself"
 - v22 ~ "they will bear the burden with you"

Xition: I want to emphasize 3 things about delegation . . .

1. Delegation is God's Design

- Man is <u>responsible</u> for the earth
 - Ps 115.16 ~ "The heaven, even the heavens, are the Lord's; But the earth He has <u>given</u> to the children of men" ~ (*Responsibility – not ownership*)
 - Gen 2.15 ~ "Then the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it" ~ (Adam appointed a steward)
- God <u>retains ownership</u> of the earth
 - Ps 24.1 ~ "The earth is the Lord's and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein" ~ (Paul quotes in 1 Cor 10 / Ex 19.5 & Ps 50.12 same)
 - Dan 4.17 ~ "the Most High rules in the kingdom of men, gives it to whomever He will, and sets over it the lowest of men.'" ~ Nebuchadnezzar
 - Lev 25.23 ~ "The land shall not be sold permanently, for the land is Mine; for you are strangers and sojourners with Me." ~ Jubilee laws

2. Delegation is Essential to Success

- When we're falling behind we must "multiply" efforts / not "redouble" them
- 5 excuses for <u>not</u> delegating
 - 1. "It only takes me a few minutes" / Yes, but the minutes add up
 - 2. "I know exactly what's needed" / Good reason to train someone else
 - 3. "Training someone will take too long" / You must invest time in others
 - 4. "I've tried before and it didn't work" / Why didn't it work?
 - 5. "This is too important to screw up" / Where's the line?

3. Delegation Must be Done Right

- Two extremes abdication –or– micromanagement (*see saw*)
 - <u>III</u>: <u>Veggie Tales founder</u> offloaded responsibility to 2 key people
 - Company must have felt like a runaway train
- Delegation must be clear what's included / what's excluded
- Examples of details to be addressed:
 - o "What specifically is to be accomplished?"
 - o "By when must it be done?"
 - o "What will be the measure of success?"
 - "Who can be relied upon for assistance?"
 - "How much \$ do we have to get job done?"

Joash Becomes King of Judah

- Seven years earlier Jehu took over in Samaria killed kings Israel / Judah
- Athaliah queen mother then killed all male heirs to the throne
- But Jehoshabeth (Joash' aunt) saved the infant Joash

Xition: Let's look at start of Joash' reign as king . . .

Joash Becomes King of Judah (2 Chr 24)

- v1 ~ Joash 7 when he became king
- v3 ~ Joash gets two wives and has sons and daughters
 Likely married no earlier than 14 then several years having children
- v4 ~ <u>After this</u> "Joash set his heart to repairing the house of the Lord"
 Likely in his early 20's
- **v5**a ~ Instructs priests and Levites to gather money to repair temple
- **v5b** ~ He says "do it <u>quickly</u>, However the Levites did not do it quickly"
 - Years have passed Joash is 30 years old in **2 Kings 12.6**

Joash' Initial Plan to Repair Temple Fails

- v5 \sim Joash tasked priests and Levites / v6 \sim Held Jehoiada accountable
- "What was the specific process to collect money and make repairs?"
 - Chr indicates Levites were to go out and get \$ and make repairs
 - Kings indicates priests were to make the repairs using \$ brought in
 - The problem was that no \$ came to the priests for this purpose
 - King accuses Jehoiada of not holding Levites accountable
 - v6 ~ "Why have you not required the Levites.."

Joash' <u>Remedial</u> Plan to Repair Temple Succeeds

- We don't know if king's question of Jehoiada was answered
- v8 ~ ".. at the king's command they made a chest"
- 2 Ki 12.9 ~ "Jehoiada the priests took a chest and bored a hole in its lid"
- Levites bypassed in second attempt to collect \$

Assessing Joash' Oversight of 1st Attempt

- Reading both accounts reveals complex method of implementation
- Levites were critical component yet weren't held accountable
- Years passed with little or no oversight from Joash / Jehoiada
- Joash confronts Jehoiada with question . . . (115 years old)
- Jehoiada's wisdom likely prevailed leading to 2nd attempt

Assessing Joash' Oversight of 2nd Attempt

- The king and high priest both owned the second attempt
- King commanded chest and Jehoiada bored hole in lid and placed it near altar
- v9 ~ "proclamation throughout Judah" / Priests ensured \$ placed in chest
- King's scribe, high priest's officer, and Levites bagged & counted \$
- Money given to specific men that oversaw temple repairs

Xition: Note 2 critical differences in 2 attempts . . .

Note Centralization vs. Decentralization

- Initially king tasked Levites with key role <u>centralized \$ collection</u>
- He <u>decentralized</u> this allowing people to bring \$ directly to temple
 - Read vss 8-10 ~ "Then at the .. all had given"
- Read 2 Kings 12.4-6 ~ "And Jehoash said .. damages of the temple"
 o King had <u>decentralized repairs</u> in 1st attempt but centralized in 2nd
- Decentralization is not always the right solution

Note the Increase of Pace

- Read v11 ~ "So it was .. day by day .. money in abundance"
- Years without progress, but now chest is filling up every few days
- Even had extra \$ to furnish new utensils for temple
