Communion Meditation – The Suffering Servant

Isaiah 53.10

Offering

October 16th, 2011

v10a ~ "Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him"

- The word "pleased" cannot be explained away
 - 1. God derived pleasure from Christ being bruised
 - 2. Some <u>critics</u> refer to Christ's <u>penal substitutionary atonement</u> as "child abuse"
 - 3. The goal of a child abuser is pleasure ~ sought through perverse means
 - 4. But "Was God's goal in the cross His own pleasure?"
 - No... The goal was saving man from sin's penalty yet satisfying justice
- Note it is said that God "bruised" Him
 - 1. God referred to this in **Gen 3.15** when He said "you shall bruise His heel"
 - 2. God foretold using Satan as a tool to fulfill His goal of rescuing mankind
 - What was Satan striking out at God (like a snake) was our salvation

v10b ~ "He has put Him to grief"

- The bruising of Christ tormented His <u>soul</u> as well as His <u>body</u>
- His physical pain was real so was His emotional / spiritual torment
 - 1. "My God! My God! Why have You forsaken Me?"

v10c ~ "When You make His soul an offering for sin"

- Jesus, body and soul, is clearly referenced as an offering for sin
 - 1. 2 Cor 5.21 ~ "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin"
 - 2. OT refs ~ Jesus was "a food offering, an aroma pleasing to the LORD"
 - 3. Read **Gen 8.20-22** Tt was Christ's future death that backed this . . .

v10d ~ "He shall see His seed"

- These 5 words imply 2 incredible truths
 - 1. Christ shall exist beyond His sacrifical death (resurrection)
 - 2. Christ shall have offspring (even though he was "cut off" v8)

"The pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand"

God is One and God acted as One in accomplishing man's redemption

Death and suffering will one day be swallowed up in victory

The victory that we celebrate today will accomplish this in time on this earth
