Righteous Behavior Described

- v30a ~ "mouth of the righteous speaks <u>wisdom</u>" ~ "not <u>foolishness</u>"
 III: Tony: Advice of deacon to divorce his wife ~ "happy"
- v30b ~ "tongue talks of justice" ~ "not lawlessness"
 We Christians should honor lawful authority
- v31a ~ "law of his God is in his heart" ~ "not love"
 - God's law drives out foolishness / Love too often tolerates it . . .
- v31b ~ "None of his steps shall slide" ~ <u>safety</u> vs jeopardy
 - We are <u>safe with God</u> / let's not be worriers

Wicked Behavior Described

- v32a ~ "wicked <u>watches</u> the righteous" ~ "not <u>ignores</u>"
 - The wicked <u>oppose</u> the righteous with <u>passion</u>
 - Jesus said why this is, "I testify of it that its works are evil" (Jn 7.7)
 - We sometimes <u>want</u> to think they don't notice ~ but <u>they see</u> it all
 - The wicked often justify themselves based on our sins
 - We then model either <u>self-righteousness</u> / or <u>Christ</u>-righteousness
- v32b ~ "seeks to <u>slay</u> him" ~ "not <u>save</u> him"
 - Your <u>unbelieving</u> friends plot your ruin
 - 2 Tim 2.26 ~ "taken captive by him to do his will")
 - o If you're more comfortable with unbelievers than with believers,
 - Does that say you're more comfortable with <u>Satan's followers</u> than God's?

God's Behavior Described

- v33a ~ "will not leave him in his hand" ~ rescue vs abandon
 - God <u>doesn't</u> always <u>prevent</u> it ~ but He <u>always remedies</u> it
- v33b ~ "nor <u>condemn</u> him when judged" ~ God <u>justifies</u> us (*though unworthy*)
 - $\circ~$ The wicked <u>refuse forgiveness</u> $\sim~$ too proud and comfortable with sin
 - o <u>*III*</u>: <u>Bumper sticker</u>: "Faith is a journey, not a guilt trip"

We Christians have <u>accepted</u> God's <u>forgiveness</u> ~ But <u>we forget our need</u> of it We <u>deceive ourselves</u> thinking we're <u>worthy</u> of God's love & forgiveness
