#### **Communion Meditation – Psalm 32**

Psalm 32.3 Robbed of Joy August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2012

## vss 1 & 2 ~ Blessed are the Forgiven

- Being forgiven by God is the greatest possible blessing
- But we don't always enjoy it to the fullest . . .
- Sometimes we barely enjoy it at all . . .

## vs 3a ~ "When I kept silent, my bones grew old"

- <u>David</u> wrote this psalm ~ He'd been a <u>believer</u> all of his life . . .
- God forgives us and cleanses us from sin and guilt
- We are <u>free</u> from our <u>bondage</u> ~ free from our former <u>lusts</u> . . .
- But we can (and often do) return to them willingly
  - We <u>try</u> to do so <u>secretly</u> ~ without anyone knowing (not even God)
- But our <u>hidden sins</u> eat away at our very core ("bones grew old")

#### Self-deceit Robs us of the Blessings of Forgiveness

- David has just <u>emerged</u> from a long period of <u>self-deception</u>
  - He'd left the <u>darkness</u> of sin and returned to the <u>light</u> of God's love
  - o <u>III</u>: Skipping school in winter ~ oak tree ~ warmth of house
- This verse is for us <u>non-Nathanaels</u> (John 1.47 ~ "in whom is no deceit")
- David just <u>warned</u> against this in v2b ~ "in whose spirit there is no deceit")
- <u>David lived it</u> ~ Most of us do too . . .

# vs 3b ~ "Through my groaning all the day long"

- Our groanings are indicators of the conditions of our hearts
- <u>III</u>: Co-worker at <u>artifacts</u> review ~ groaned with each new slide
- Bearing sin is a costly practice ~ groaning reflects this high cost

Groaning under the load of sin reflects the <u>tremendous weight</u> of it
This is a weight that <u>we cannot bear</u> ~ It eventually crushes us

Jesus bore the weight ~ But even He staggered under it's weight in the Garden

He groaned in agony under the weight of sin

But this too is a <u>tremendous blessing</u> we'll explore more next time
