Communion Meditation – Jonah

Jonah 1.8-10 (read 7 to 10) "Jonah the Hypocrite" May 5th, 2013

v8 ~ "Then they said to him . . . Who are you?"

- The sailors ask him 5 questions / Newcomers are often asked such questions
 - He answers only the last one "of what people are you" / "I am a Hebrew"
 - v9 ~ Then he says, "I fear the Lord .. who made the sea and the dry land."
- Jonah doesn't answer the questions they asked . . .
 - $\circ~$ But he gives them the information they seek . . .

Asking Questions and Giving Answers

- The sailors ask 5 questions: WHOSE WHAT WHERE WHAT WHAT
- Jonah gives his answer and then they ask one more
 - v10 ~ "Why have you done this?" / This is what they really want to know
 - "What kind of man is so brazen as to offend such a powerful God?"
 - They are somewhat in awe of this man who dares to defy his God

Hypocrisy

- In Num 32.23 Moses warns eastern tribes about not helping subdue western land
 - Moses told Gad & Reuben, "But if you do not do so, then take note, you have sinned against the LORD; and be sure your sin will find you out."
 - o "Your sin will find you out."
 - "Are there more truthful words in all of Scripture?"
 - <u>Ill</u>: <u>Magazine in road- Camp Pendleton</u> best of intentions / vehicle check

Jonah is Being Hypocritical

- Jonah is willfully defying God's clear direction
- Yet he tells these men, "I fear the Lord."
- Both of these actions reflect Jonah's true character / defiance, but fear of God

To a degree we are all hypocrites ~ We do not live up to the standards we espouse We can <u>lower the standards</u> (many do) ~ Or <u>pretend we meet them</u> (many do) But the past of <u>honesty</u> and <u>integrity</u> requires that we do neither ... We must uphold the standards while confessing our failure to meet them ... <u>humility</u>
