Transitioning to Personal Responsibility

- Two messages ago Moses shifted blame for his sin to the people
- Last time (bronze serpent) people admitted sin when confronted
- Moses had been larger than life for Israelites / He was "the" mediator
 - o But he'd fallen from that pedestal / They acknowledged their sin
 - They recognized Moses' role but they also accepted responsibility

In the Wilderness / In the World

- Israelites had just bypassed <u>Edom</u> and <u>Moab</u>
 - o But Balak wouldn't let them pass / He feared them / Sent for Balaam
 - Story of Balaam / <u>Angel</u> opposes him / Talking <u>donkey</u> / Blesses 3 times
 - o Months later <u>Balaam killed</u> in Joshua's war against Midianites
- Rev 2.14 against church of <u>Pergamos</u>, "you have there those who hold the
 doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the children
 of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols, and to commit sexual immorality."

Apostasy Judged Harshly

- v1 ~ "the people began to commit harlotry with the women of Moab"
- v2 ~ "the people ate and bowed down to their gods"
- God directs them to "hang the offenders before the Lord" (v4)
- Moses says to judges, "kill .. men who were joined to Baal of Peor" (v5)
- Phineas thrusts javelin through couple ending plague (v8) 24k die (v9)

Church Must Address Sin & Apostasy

- God was <u>pleased</u> with what <u>Phineas</u> did / <u>Ended</u> horrible <u>plague</u>
- God expected the Israelite leaders to address this rampant sin
- God expects the same from the Church today
 - o The Church "in the spirit of Phineas" must act to call sin, sin
 - Periodically we excommunicate people from Church (refuse to repent)

Coming to the Table admits an <u>embrace</u> of God's <u>rules</u>

Coming to the Table admits an <u>acceptance</u> of God's <u>forgiveness</u>
