Communion Meditation – Colossians

Colossians 1.24-26 "Us in Place of Christ"

Contrast of This With Last Message

- Last message c/vss19-23 was "Christ in Place of Us"
- Today's message is "Us in Place of Christ"
- Today's message is only about v24

v24a ~ "I now rejoice in my sufferings for you"

- Paul is not a <u>masochist</u> / He does not like <u>pain</u> or being <u>tortured</u>
 - Nor is God a <u>sadist</u> / He doesn't take pleasure in our suffering itself
- So "why does Paul 'rejoice' in his 'suffering'"?
- "for you" ~ He's speaking not only of Colossians / but of <u>all churches</u>

v24b ~ "fill up in my flesh what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ"

- This phrase <u>means</u> something special / But it also <u>doesn't</u> mean something
 - This does not mean Christ's sacrifice lacked any atoning value
 - Read Heb 10.11-14 "And every priest . . who are being sanctified."
 - This does mean the Church's ongoing sacrifice serves a God-given purpose
 - Read 1 Peter 4.12-14 "Beloved, do not think . . He is glorified."

v24c ~ "for the sake of His body which is the church"

- The sufferings of the Church (through individuals) results in strength
- To <u>Tertullian</u> is credited, "The blood of martyrs is the seed of the Church."
- <u>Cause</u> and <u>effect</u> are not easily discerned
 - Does Church grow because of persecution? -or-
 - Does persecution come because of growth of the Church?

Christ's sacrificial death <u>fully satisfied</u> the Father's requirement for justice But those who hated Christ were <u>not satisfied</u>

Those that hate Christ will <u>never</u> be fully satisfied

The Church continues to bear their abuse and reproach Persecution of Christians

- 1) highlights the ongoing relevance of Christ and the Church, and
- 2) tends toward the purification and growth of the Church, or
- 3) the judgment of God in extinguishing it in a people
