Communion Meditation

James 4.8 Draw Near to God August 8th, 2017

"Draw near to God"

- To "draw near" is more than a physical action
 - This sentence wouldn't make sense otherwise
- God is everywhere / "in Him we live and move and have our being"

"What is Communion?"

- Two definitions of the word from dictionary or Bible
 - 1st "the sharing or exchanging of intimate thoughts and feelings, especially when the exchange is on a spiritual level"
 - 2nd "the service of Christian worship at which bread and wine are consecrated and shared"
- We're engaged in 2nd definition / But it has meaning only to those w/1st

"and He will draw near to You"

- God makes the first move in our salvation / But this is not salvation
- James encourages us to "draw near to God"
 - This presumes we're <u>not as close</u> as we can be / as we'd <u>like</u> to be
- "Do you enjoy spiritual intimacy with God?" / "Are you near to Him?"
 - If you're not as close as you'd like James gives 2 reasons why

"cleanse your hands you sinners; purify your hearts, you double-minded"

- "hands" reflects our actions
- "hearts" reflects our thoughts / desires
- Though we know & love God / Our thoughts & actions can go astray
- Pro 18.1 ~ "A man who isolates himself seeks his own desire"
 - There's a good isolation and there's a bad isolation
 - We must isolate ourselves only to be intimate with God

Quote at start was from <u>Acts 17</u> – Paul preaching at <u>Areopagus</u>

Read Acts 17.24-28 ~ "God who made the world .. have our being."

God commands <u>all men everywhere</u> to seek Him while He may be found

That command is true for believer and unbeliever Unbeliever seeks salvation / Believer seeks deeper communion
